Dean Lisa Neeley provided the following comments regarding the retirement of Paul Hidy, Automotive Technology Instructor:

In many ways, Paul Hidy is synonymous with the Automotive Technology Center. His commitment over the years has seem the transformation from a small program at Armijo HS to the building on Georgia Street before flourishing into the flagship program on the corner of Turner and North Ascot. Before joining Solano Paul taught high school auto shop and was a tenured instructor at College of the Redwoods. With over 18 years as an automotive technician, Paul has worked across the industry in dealerships, independent shops, and government fleets.

I met Paul 3 years ago when I joined the CTE division. We would meet weekly to discuss program needs and during that time I have been impressed by his leadership and ability to build strong relationships with students, faculty, staff, and external employers. Paul was the driving force behind our successful ASE and NATEF accreditation, and partnerships with companies like Ford and Mercedes-Benz USA, who regularly hire our students. Paul has been a humble, collaborative leader who always put the needs of students first, offering creative solutions and innovative approaches. I have appreciated his candor and willingness to advocate robustly and energetically for students. Two years ago, we started discussing a summer boot camp idea – I know Paul is proud to see it become a reality this summer.

Chip Reeves: Paul's work at ATEC will have an impact for generations to come. His vision for the facility and the instruction that takes place here is the best in California. The way he has kept ATEC on the cutting edge of automotive technology and brought it right into the classroom shows in the caliber of our students. Thank you for the leadership you have given me as an instructor.
