CDFS 038: Child Development and Family Studies 038 - Child Growth and Development

Examine the major physical, cognitive, and psychosocial developmental milestones (typical and atypical) and theories from conception through adolescence. Emphasis is placed on the interaction between maturational processes and environmental factors. Current research and methodologies are examined. Child observations and analysis are included. Field trip may be required.

HIST 017: History 017 - History of the U.S. to 1877

Survey of the history of the United States from its Native American, African and European origins through the period of Civil War and Reconstruction. Emphasis is placed on analyzing the major economic, social, political, and cultural events, movements and trends that shaped historical developments, examining cause and effect relationships and interpreting primary and secondary sources.

PLSC 001: Political Science 001 - Introduction to American Government and Politics

Introduction to the theory and practice of American politics, this course includes and analysis of the operation of national, state, and local governments, as well as the U.S. and California Constitutions.

PSYC 001: Psychology 001 - Introduction to Psychology

Introduction to psychology as the scientific study of human behavior and mental processes. Major topics include history of field, scientific method, sensation and perception, brain and nervous system, states of consciousness, development, learning, memory, cognition, motivation, emotion, personality, tests and measurements, health psychology, behavior disorders and treatment, and social psychology.

SOC 001: Sociology 001 - Introduction to Sociology

Introduction to sociology with analysis of a variety of concepts and theories in relation to culture, socialization, social inequality, race relations, sex roles, deviance, and the distribution of political and economic power.
