Memorandum of Understanding

Between

Solano Community College (SCC)

And

California State University, Sonoma (SSU)

Solano Community College and California State University, Sonoma, desire to establish a relationship between the two institutions who agree to cooperate with each other as follows:

Scope of Cooperation

Subject to mutual consent, the areas of cooperation will include academic and support services offered by both institutions to carry out the development and implementation of Guaranteed Admissions. SCC will identify a Guaranteed Admissions point person and/or task force to implement the items listed in the scope of cooperation.

- A. SSU will communicate to the SCC point person regarding Guaranteed Admissions policies and processes and related upcoming SSU events and provide promotional materials and messaging regarding Guaranteed Admissions and related SSU programs and services for the SCC point person to distribute utilizing SCC communication tools. Communications may target populations such as: CC counselors, students, parents, student associations, clubs, etc.
- B. SCC will allow an SSU Representative, per the SSU Representative's availability, to promote Guaranteed Admissions to students. SCC will be responsible for coordinating and reserving a venue location for up to two presentations per academic calendar year.
- C. SCC will ensure that all students seeking Guaranteed Admissions complete A1 (speech), A2 (English composition), A3 (critical thinking) and B4 (GE Math) with a C- or better, a 2.0 minimum grade point average and 60 transferable units with 30 of those units being general education courses with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 for non-impacted majors.
- D. SCC acknowledges that Guaranteed Admissions does not apply to Impacted Majors as they have their own set of criteria that need to be met.

- a. Students who meet CSU minimum requirements but do not meet impacted major requirements will be admitted into their alternate major if listed on the application. See list of Impacted Majors.
- E. SSU will organize campus events and programming annually for SCC students and families.
- F. SCC students must submit a Cal State Apply Application to SSU and pay the application fee by the application deadline.
 - a. SCC or another organization on behalf of SCC may <u>purchase application fee</u> coupon codes from the CSU to distribute to students.
- G. SCC students seeking Guaranteed Admission to SSU must complete an ADT or transfer pathway and be in good standing in the Fall or Spring term prior to their admission entry term at SSU.
- H. SCC will sign up as an eTrancript CA partner within the first year of the MOU and ensure delivery of transcripts to SSU is exclusively sent using eTranscript CA.

The terms for each specific service or activity implemented under this *Memorandum of* Understanding shall be mutually agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of that activity and subject to available resources each academic year. Any such agreements entered into, as outlined above, will form appendixes to this Memorandum of Understanding. The Board may adopt one of several rates: (A.1) District average cost; (A.2) District average cost with 10% or more noncredit FTES (B.1) Statewide average cost; (B.2) Highest statewide average cost; (C) No more than the rate of a contiguous district; (D) Between statewide average expense of education and District expense of education; (E) no more than 12 comparable states 2019-2020 average tuition.

In addition, per <u>Education Code Section 76141</u>, a District may also charge to any nonresident student a capital outlay fee.

It is recommended that the District's 2023-2024 nonresident and international student fee be established at \$368.00 per unit, which is the statewide average expense of education, and \$11 per semester unit for nonresidential capital outlay. The new fee will be lower than other colleges in our region.

Resolution No. 22/23-28 is attached, along with the 2023-2024 Nonresident Fee Worksheet.

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 76140 mandates that the proposed tuition fee be increased by the United States Consumer Price Index (U.S.P.I.) for two fiscal years, as determined by the Department of Finance, State of California.

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 76141 authorizes each District to charge nonresident students a capital outlay fee; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the district nonresident and international student fee for the academic year 2022-2023, beginning with the summer session, be established at \$368.00 per unit, which is based on (C) no more than the rate of a contiguous district, and the \$11 per semester unit for nonresident capital outlay.

Services Provided

Petting zoo from 2:30mto 4pm

Petting zoo animals should always include but are not limited to: 3 chickens, 2 bunnies, 2 goats, and 2 ducks unless otherwise agreed upon. Some events may be entitled to more animals of the same variety; however, this is not guaranteed and is given based on availability and expected number of visitors.

Fees and Other Charges

The total fees for this event are \$_400\$ for the time period of 1.5 hrs A deposit of \$_0\$ is due at the official time of booking. The remaining balance of \$_400\$ with the additional cost of time if the client wishes to extend the booking is due following the scheduled time of booking. Payment may be accepted in the form of cash, check, Venmo (@Morgan-Sasser-2), PayPal (info@allaboutafarm.com), or credit/debit card.

Cancellation Policy

- a. Deposits are non-refundable for client cancellations made 24 hours or more past the time of initial payment.
- b. Time/date changes made less than 24 hours before the scheduled start time are subject to a \$25 inconvenience fee.
- c. If All About a Farm is to cancel the booking, the client is entitled to the choice of: a full refund of the deposit, a credit with All About a Farm to be used at a later time, or a priority re-booking.
- d. Coronavirus/natural disaster clause- In the state of an emergency or pandemic where it is mandatory to cancel the booking, deposits are kept as a credit with All About a Farm. It is expected that the client will reschedule within one calendar

- c. Parking space large enough for 1 car + 1 mini trailer no more than 1000 ft from the setup area

Petting Zoo Rules

Major rules will be explained by the attendant prior to or during entry, but guests are expected to adhere to the following:

- 1) Animals should not be picked up, carried, or held.
- 2) Hands, fingers, and toes are to be kept out of animals' orifices.
- 3) All guests should enter and exit through the petting zoo gate.
- 4) All guests should clean their hands with the provided hand sanitizer or wet wipes after interacting with the animals. Guests who decline or refuse hand sanitizer are expected to use their own or to wash their hands with soap and water.

Safety Policy

- a. We reserve the right to disallow anyone from interacting with the animals for safety considerations.
- b. If at any time the client feels a safety measure must be taken, it is to be the attendant's priority to determine the best mode of action.

Program: District staff and Bond Program team members continue to work on revisions to the Design Standards. We continue planning for and implementing the projects being funded by Series D and E funds.
