The College celebrated Pride Month on June 15th at the Vacaville and Vallejo centers and on the main campus. Trustee Quinten Voyce and several others were speakers at the main campus event held at the flag pole near Building 400. The event was well attended by faculty, staff, and students as well as staff from the Solano Pride Center. We heard from faculty who appreciate the support they receive from the College recognizing that there are still may places where LGBTQ faculty, staff, and students do not feel safe being out. Many thanks to faculty David "Matthew" Schweitzer, VP Lisa Neeley, and Admin Asst. Tiffany Casimere for organizing the event and for creating a safe and fun environment for all. The Pride Center is in room 414 and opened in January 2023. We will have an official opening in fall.

We are again offering summer bootcamps for 8th-12th grade students and for adults. The programs are:

- Auto Tech with three cohorts that began June 12 and run through June 29th.
- Robotics for 10th-12th grade and adult students
- Cybercamps for 8th-12th grade and college students and include introductory, intermediate, and advanced camp
- Cosmetology State Board Bootcamp was offered May 29-June 2
- And, Hair Camp which began June 5th with weeks 1 and 2, weeks 3 and 4 began this week, and week 5 begins July 5th.
- Additionally, the Auto Tech Center is hosting its annual Car Show this Saturday, June 24 from 10am-2pm
- Summer Algebra Institute in June & July on the main campus
- SCOE Girls Robotics Bootcamp in June & July at main campus and Centers
- Upward Bound Immersion Program in June & July at the Vallejo Campus

- Cybersecurity Bootcamp July 10-28 on the main campus
- UC Davis Cell and Gene Therapy Manufacturing Bootcamp in June
- Film Bootcamp in July on the main campus

Summer enrollment continues to improve over previous years with our headcount at 4,570 compared to 4,185 this time last year, and our resident FTES is at 810 compared to 529 this time last year.
