SECURITY SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement made September 5, 2024 by and between Unlimited Security Specialists Inc. (USS) and; Solano Community College at 4000 Suisun Valley Road, Fairfield, CA 94534 (Client).

The PartiesAgree as Follows:

Client requests that **USS** furnish Client, on the terms and subject to the conditions of this Agreement, the services of **USS** Personnel (**SecurityAgents**) and related equipment at Client's premises located at **4000 Suisun Valley Road**, **Fairfield**, **CA. 94534**.

The number of Security Agents, the times at which Security Agents shall render services to Client, the equipment to be furnished by **USS** and the rates and amount to be paid by Client to **USS** for such services and equipment are set forth in the Schedule of Charges for Security Services and Equipment which is on the last page of this Agreement. **Unlimited Security Specialists Inc.** is providing such services and equipment subject to all of the terms and conditions hereof.

Unlimited Security Specialists Inc. will render invoices to Client every week, or longer intervals as **USS** and Client agree to in writing until January 31, 2025

Invoices will be dated by **USS** the first Monday of each month and are due and payable in full by Client upon receipt. It shall be presumed that all invoices mailed to Client are received by Client within two days of mailing. All amounts not paid within net 30 days of the date of invoice will be deemed overdue, and will bear late charges at the lower of 2% per month or the maximum percentage allowed by law.

This Agreement shall not be binding on **USS** unless accepted in writing by an authorized agent of **USS**, and is terminable at any time by **USS** or Client upon 30 days of written notice to the other party.

SECURITY SERVICE

Client warrants and represents that it is in legal possession of the Premises, or that it is duly authorized to enter into this Agreement and make the authorization set forth in this paragraph, on behalf of the person or entity in legal possession of the premises.

All Security Agents and other personnel of **USS** are the employees or agents solely of **USS**, and not the Client. **Unlimited Security Specialists Inc.** reserves the right to hire, suspend, discipline or discharge any and all of its Security Agents and other USS personnel. If Client is dissatisfied with the services of a particular Security Agent and if Client notifies **USS**, in writing or Via Email, of its dissatisfaction, then so long as such dissatisfaction is reasonable, **USS** shall endeavor to replace such Security Agent with another Security Agent as soon as practicable. **Unlimited Security Specialists Inc.** is acting solely as an independent contractor.

Client agrees not to employ, directly or indirectly, any person who has been employed by **USS** within 120 days following the last day **USS** employed such person. In the event Client breaches this provision, then, in addition to any and all other remedies to which **USS** shall be entitled, Client agrees to pay **USS** forthwith the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) per person to cover **USS** recruitment, screening and training costs.

If additional personnel/coverage is desired by Client after the rate effective hereof, the rate to be charged hereunder will be agreed to at that time.

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BILLING, TERMS AND RATES

Client hereto agrees that **USS** shall have the right to increase the hourly rates provided for herein at any time or times after the expiration or one year from the date hereof, upon giving Client written notice 30 days in advance of the effective date of such increase. If Client desires not to pay such increased charge, Client must notify **USS** in writing 10 days prior to the effective date of any such increase. Failure by Client to give **USS** such notice shall be deemed agreed to by Client to the increased rates. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, in the event the direct labor cost of **USS** is increased by virtue of any increase in state or federal minimum work rates, other legislation, regulation or taxes, **USS** may increase its rates to reflect such increase. In addition, the rates may be increased in the event of any strike or emergency conditions which render the services more difficult to provide. A 1.5% rate increase will automatically be applied at the beginning of each calendar year, starting in 2024

PROPERTY

Client acknowledges and agrees that this Agreement is for the providing of services only, that all equipment furnished by **USS** pursuant to this Agreement shall be for the use of **USS** personnel, that title and possession of such equipment shall remain in **USS** at all times, and that the personnel **USS** may enter onto and into the Premises at any time for the purpose of removing any or all such equipment. Removal of any or all such equipment shall be without prejudice to the rights of **USS** to the collection of all amounts due under this Agreement.

LIMITS OF LIABILITY

Client acknowledges that **USS** is not an insurer, and that the security services provided hereby do not constitute maximum security. The security services are intended to act only as a deterrent and to provide only a degree of security to carry out the written operating procedures or Post Orders. The amounts payable to **USS** under this Agreement are not based upon the value of the Client's property, nor the property of others located in or about Client's premises. The services provided under this Agreement are solely for the benefit of Client and neither this Agreement nor any services rendered hereunder shall create or be deemed to create any rights in any other party as a third party beneficiary. Client agrees to indemnify and hold **USS** harmless against any and all claims by such third parties. **Unlimited Security Specialists Inc.** shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance covering its Security Officers and other personnel engaged in the furnishing of services under this Agreement. In addition, **USS** shall maintain for its own protection Comprehensive General Liability and Automobile coverage (\$2,000,000). **Unlimited Security Specialists Inc.** shall not be liable for any claim, demand or liability resulting in whole or particular and security and claims demand or liability resulting in whole or

from any negligent or willful act of Client, or any of Client's employees, officers, directors or representatives.

TERMINATIONAND RIGHTS

If Client shall fail to pay any amount hereunder within 30 days after the same is due and payable, or if Client shall fail to perform any other provision hereof within 10 days after USS shall have requested in writing the performance thereof, or if any proceeding in bankruptcy, receivership of insolvency shall be commenced by or against Client or Client's property, or if Client makes any assignment for the benefit of creditors, USS shall have the right, without prior notice to Client, immediately to terminate this Agreement and cease rendering all services to Client hereunder, and USS shall be entitled to recover the existing amount due from Client and all other sums to which USS may be entitled under law, and shall be entitled to remove from the Premises all equipment furnished by USS located or installed thereon. Removal of any such equipment or the cessation of any such services supplied by USS shall not be a breach by USS of this Agreement or a waiver by USS of any damages or rights.

Client agrees to pay **USS** the reasonable costs incurred by **USS** in collection of any amounts owed by Client, or in enforcing any other rights of **USS** hereunder, including, in the event **USS** institutes legal proceedings to collect such amounts or enforce such rights, reasonable attorney's fees and disbursement incurred in such proceedings.

Unlimited Security Specialists Inc. assumes no liability for delay or interruption of the services of any personnel of **USS** due to strikes, riots, floods, fires, acts of the public enemy, terrorism or any cause beyond the control of **USS**, or any act of God or matter of force majeure.

Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or breach thereof, shall be settled at arbitration in accordance with the Commercial Arbitration Rules of American Arbitration Association, and judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. Such arbitration shall take place in **Los Angeles California**.

Any party hereto may obtain any provisional remedy, including but not limited to an attachment in any court of competent jurisdiction, without waiving the right to arbitration.

In the event any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement shall be invalid or inoperative, all of the remaining terms and provisions shall remain in full force and effect. This Agreement is intended by the parties as a final expression of their agreement and is a complete and exclusive statement of the terms thereof. This Agreement supersedes all prior representations, understandings and agreements of the parties and the parties rely upon the contents of this Agreement in executing it. The ad hoc committee will forward recommendations to the Superintendent-President for review and feedback. The S-P will forward recommendations to the Governing Board who may choose to accept, decline, or table the recommendation.

Solano Community College's mission is to educate a culturally and academically diverse student population drawn from our local communities and beyond. Solano Community College transforms students' lives with transfer courses, career and technical education, and basic skills preparation leading to certificate programs, associate's degrees, bachelor's degrees, and lifelong learning opportunities.

Criteria:

Juwan Vartanian, as an immigrant, student and long term employee has both embodied and carried out the mission of our college. Drawing on her own experience she was able to meet the needs of our diverse student body where they are at in their educational journey and uplift them to achieve goals they themselves may not yet see.

Juwan has spent over 30 years working directly with our students in the field of early childhood education (ECE) as an Early Learning Specialist. In the academic year 2022/23 ECE had the highest awarded certificate in the entire college. These students are over 90% female and over 2/3 are people of color. Ms. Vartanian is directly responsible for lifting these women up by being a model of high quality professionalism as they navigate their educational goals.

In the role of Early Education Specialist Ms. Vartanian not only reached students but also the children and families of SCC. The majority of these families are adult students attending our college and over 90% of them receive subsidized assistance to both attend school and have their children cared for on campus. Research shows that students are 3 times as likely to complete their educational goals, on time, if utilizing care for their children on campus.

2. To what extent has the individual/organization/company remained engaged with the College?

Ms. Varianian has remained connected both directly and indirectly to the college. In 2024, with the completion of the new Toddler building infrastructure and adjoining outdoor play space, Ms. Varianian has returned as a consultant in designing the use of this space. Her long years of expertise in environmental design will ensure that future learners, both adults and children, will have the opportunity to succeed.

Another very telling way that Ms. Vartanian has remained connected to the college is through her legacy of impacting dedicated professionals. Of the 6 Early Learning Specialists employed by Solano Community College, half were her direct mentees when both taking their student teaching and as student workers. Each has gone on with success in the field of Early Childhood Education and then returned to give back to the college where they got their start to do the same work they saw their own mentor contribute to.

3. To what extent will recognizing the individual/organization/company inspire others to support the College?

It is valuable here to note that not only does the ELC prepare our future teachers, but they also serve our nursing students during their pediatric rotations. Ms. Vartanian herself was invited to support the creation of high quality spaces for children in school across the Bay Area. By recognizing our most tenured Early Learning Specialist the college demonstrates its commitment to this work and a commitment to quality. Through this demonstration we hope that both the CA Department of Education and our Local Solano Office of Education continue to support our efforts in workforce development.

4. To what extent will recognizing the individual/organization/company add value to the College?

Juwan Vartanian's classroom has been documented in publications by WestEd, the CA Department of Education, popular college textbooks and other publications. In 2022 a colleague of mine, Senta Green, was doing trainings in a number of provinces in China. Even then the videos and vignettes were taken from Solano Community College's Early Learning Center. By accepting this nomination SCC recognized the long commitment to quality provided by Juwan Vartanian.

Good evening president superintendent and board members, my name is Sabrina Drake and I am the interim Director of the ELC and it is my pleasure to share a bit about Juwan Vartanian who is retiring from SCC after an incredible 30-year career. Doyleen, the Director of the Children's programs in 1992 saw potential in an ECE student and recruited her to start working with Infants and Toddlers at SCC. At the time, Juwan was working for Vallejo Unified School District with preschoolers and was reluctant to work with the younger age group, but Doyleen persevered. Lucky us.

Juwan fell in love with working with infants and toddlers and invested her time and energy into providing the most idyllic environment and individual care for those children to be in while away from their families. Word of her skill with creating magical environments and activity invitations that were aesthetically appealing and engaging spread widely. Janet Gonzalez-Mena an ECE instructor at Napa Valley College used photos of Juwan's environment and her primary care routine in her newest textbook on caring for infants and toddlers and would continue to visit Juwan's space for subsequent editions. Faculty at Consumnes River College took photos of Juwan's invitations for their book "Loose Parts'. Juwan was a huge advocate for reusing found materials many of which she would pick up at local thrift stores. We have had many guests come to visit Juwan's natural environment as inspiration for their own classrooms in addition to an annual tour during the ECE Conference.

Juwan attended West Ed (Program for Infant Toddler Care) and became more of a regional expert. So much so, that PITC itself use photos and videos for their training materials. I recall attending a northern California meeting as a CDTC Coordinator shortly after Tony Ayala was hired. He was at the same meeting as the Mentor Coordinator, and I was very excited to share with him that the videos that they were showing to the audience were of Juwan's yard and classroom!

Most recently again Tony Ayala told me that Senta Greene a trainer for PITC on Culture, Family and Providers went to China to train caregivers and some of the videos used were of Juwan's; she is truly a worldwide phenomenon!

She became a Mentor Teacher through the Mentor Program and shared her expertise and mentoring with hundreds of fellow teachers in our community and as a Specialist with the ELC she trained hundreds of practicum students who went into the workforce as aptly prepared infant toddler caregivers.

Juwan wanted every child to have a special experience while in our program. She worked hard to mentor new staff and advocate for changes in the program to improve. She truly made the mundane a special moment. A diaper change was not just a diaper change; it was a bonding experience for a child and their caregiver. Songs and conversation and children participating in having their diaper changed.

Anytime we may have disagreed about how many staff she needed and why the budget would not support it or equipment that was beautiful and expensive I always knew that Juwan argued for what was best for children and that they truly deserved the absolute best. Sample of key activities this quarter:

Program: District staff and Bond Program team members continued to work on Design Standards revision/updates. Two (2) Bond Spending Updates were completed during this quarter. Planning for and implementing the projects being funded by Series D, Series E, and Series F funds proceeds.

Projects:

- Fairfield Campus Building 300 Modernization Project: Move out completed and construction started.
- Fairfield Campus Building 1400 Modernization (Phase 1): Completed roof scope bidding and general contractor award process. Completed door scope design documents and prepared for bidding.
- Fairfield Campus Building 1600 Modernization Project: Addressed DSA comments and submitted documents for DSA backcheck. Obtained DSA approval to bid. Bid project.
- Fairfield Campus Early Learning Center Expansion Project: Continued interior work and sitework.
- Vacaville Annex HVAC/Roof Upgrade: Project close out continued.
- Vacaville Center Water Intrusion Mitigation: Bidding complete, and project contract successfully awarded. Submittals in process.
- Small Capital Projects Fairfield Campus Building 1400 Lighting Upgrade: Continued working with contractor's bonding surety on next steps to complete this Project.
- Small Capital Projects Fairfield Campus Building 1800 Maker Space Awning: Design work and project cost estimate were completed. Due to anticipated cost of this project's final scope, the project was placed on hold to identify next steps and available funding.
- Small Capital Projects Fairfield Campus Building 1900 Parking Lot and Storage Building: Design continued with determining best value option (pre-manufactured or AE-designed building) and identifying and incorporating stakeholder preferences.
- Small Capital Projects Fairfield Campus Main Entrance Improvement: Project remained on hold.
- Small Capital Projects Fairfield Campus Quad Water Conservation: Sitework, landscaping, and FF&E procurement continued. Underground utilities were completed. Work on walkways was begun.
- Small Capital Projects Fairfield Campus Sand Volleyball Courts: This new Project is to construct a new, four-court beach volleyball facility. A design team was selected and design was begun.

Sample of key activities this quarter (continued):

Projects:

- Small Capital Projects Campus Fire Alarm Upgrades: The Fairfield Campus' current Fire Alarm Control Panel is no longer being manufactured and future installation will need to be upgraded to a newer panel version. This new Project will develop a master plan for how to adopt the new Fire Alarm Control Panel over time and phase out the existing Panel. A design team was selected, and the evaluation and planning were begun.
- Small Capital Projects Vallejo Autotech Exhaust System/Dynamometer Replacement: Design work was completed and submitted to DSA for approval.
- Small Capital Projects Vallejo Autotech Vehicle Security: Financial close out was completed. This Project is now complete.
- Small Capital Projects Vallejo Center Security: Submittals were completed and cameras procured.

Districtwide Projects:

- Facilities Asset Management: Continued to identify, inventory, tag, and incorporate asset data into the preventative maintenance program and computerized maintenance management system (CMMS).
- IT Infrastructure Project (Phase 3): Implementation of Series D and Series E funded work continued. Equipment purchases and installations continued. Annual network upgrades continued. Gym Audio-Visual Enhancement work continued.
- IT Infrastructure Project (Phase 4): Continued planning and implementing projects associated with Series D and Series E funding, including equipment purchases and installations. Continued classroom tech upgrades, and faculty/staff/student computer upgrades proceeded. Continued with annual network upgrades, as well as printer and copier replacements. Gym Audio-Visual Enhancement work continued, as well as wireless refresh, Board Room audio-visual modernization, and B1400 audio-visual modernization.
- Infrastructure Improvements Central Plant Replacement: Chiller was removed and new chiller was being installed. Fabrication of long lead items continued.
- Infrastructure Improvements Replacement Substations #3 and #4: Coordination with adjacent projects continued. Work in the central plant building continued. Extension of Substation #4 footprint was completed.
- Infrastructure Improvements Solar Energy: Continued working on installation of new electrical equipment near Substation #1. Continued work with DSA on approval for the BESS (battery system) design.
- Infrastructure Improvements Swimming Pool Deck Replacement: Continued with close out.
- ADA Improvements (Phase 1): Work on the Self Evaluation Study of Policies and Procedures continued with District review.
