Oversight

- Measure G
 - Approved by voters in 2002
 - \$124.5 million in General Obligation Bonds
 - Coming to a close
- Measure Q
 - Approved by voters in 2012
 - \$348 million in bonds
 - Early in activity

Role of Citizens Bond Oversight Committee

- Prop 29 (2000) enable some school bond measures to pass with 55% voter approval instead of 66.7%.
- Members are appointed to the CBOC to ensure that bond expenditures are appropriate, legal and that financial and performance audits are performed annually.
- 9 members, 3-year terms, 2 terms maximum
