1. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Solano Community College District Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) was called to order by Chair Richardson at 4:02 PM, on Thursday, November 16, 2023.

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

It was moved by Steve Neff and seconded by Cary Leider to approve the agenda. The motion was passed unanimously.

4. COMMENTS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

There were no comments from members of the public.

5. APPROVAL OF AUGUST 9, 2022 MEETING MINUTES <u>and</u> NOVEMBER 9, 2023 MEETING NOTES

It was moved by Cary Leider and seconded by Steve Neff to approve the meeting minutes from the CBOC meeting held on August 9, 2022 and the notes from the CBOC meeting held on November 9, 2023. The motion passed unanimously.

6. COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP

The expired terms were discussed.

- The Member-At-Large position that expired on 11/19/21 remains open as the search for a successor continues. There was an applicant that may still be interested, but that application was not fully completed in order for it to be forwarded to the Board of Trustees' consideration.
- The Member-At-Large Construction and Building Trades position that expired on 10/7/23 will continue to be filled by Glenn Loveall. Confirmation on process will be referred to the District is Board of Trustee approval needed?

- The Bone Fide Taxpayers Association Representative position held by Janet Roberts expiring on 1/17/24 may have an interested applicant Bob Choisser. Ms. Roberts will follow-up with Mr. Choisser to see if he is interested and to let him know to reach out to Ms. Meckley-Archuleta if assistance with the application is needed.
- Chair Richardson will follow-up with the President-Superintendent regarding options for filling the Active Member in Support Organization for the College seat expiring on 1/17/24.

7. SELECTION OF NEW CBOC VICE CHAIR

There was discussion of selecting a Vice Chair. Chair Richardson asked for volunteers. Steve Neff volunteered. Before proceeding to a vote, Chair Richardson asked if there were other volunteers. Hearing none, Cary Leider moved the recommendation to elect Steve Neff for Vice Chair. The motion was seconded by Glenn Loveall and was unanimously approved. After referring to the Bylaws, the duration of this selection may be for up to three (3) years, which is the same as for the Chair.

8. UPDATE ON ANNUAL CBOC REPORT TO THE BOARD - FY2020-2021 REPORT

Chair Richardson provided a brief summary of the Board of Trustees presentation of the CBOC's Annual Report for FY2020-2021. There were no questions.

9. FY2021-2022 ANNUAL CBOC REPORT TO THE BOARD

Chair Richardson will draft the FY2021-2022 Annual Report. She will receive comments/feedback from the other CBOC members and provide a final draft for Committee approval. The Board of Trustees presentation will be scheduled when the Report is ready.

10. SLDBE PROGRAM

Small, Local, Diverse Business Enterprises (SLDBE) Program was discussed. It was noted that there are some challenges with these businesses being able to fully comply with the Program requirements. The reported data on this Program was reviewed via reference to the last Quarterly Report (Page 10). Some CBOC members commented that they felt the District was doing well based upon the data reported. There was a question asked about whether larger businesses could sponsor SLDBE-eligible businesses.

There was a quick review of UPCCAA (Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act) Program process and the value to the bond program, as well as the District.

13. PROJECT SUMMARY UPDATES

Lucky Lofton referenced the 11/10/23 monthly BOT (Board of Trustees) report to facilitate a project update, and BSP (Bond Spending Plan) #26 was referenced to address project budget questions. The following projects were highlighted, and questions from the CBOC members were addressed:

- B300 Renovation,
- Central Plant,
- Early Learning Center Expansion,
- On-Campus Housing, which is no longer a bond-funded project, was reviewed as an information only item,
- Parking Lot Repairs/Improvements,
- Pool Deck Replacement,
- Solar Energy, and
- Substations #3 and #4 Replacement.

Priscilla Meckley-Archuleta will check to confirm if the November BOT report was sent to CBOC members.

14. MEETINGS

Schedule (frequency) was discussed by the Committee. There was a consensus that quarterly meetings would be good and that the meetings should be scheduled a year in advance. There was discussion about the type of meetings (in-person, virtual, hybrid, etc.), and the members supported the hybrid model.

The CBOC members were asked for preferences for meeting days/times. There was consensus that meetings on Thursday of the second week of the month at 4PM would be a good time. It was further discussed that a poll of the Committee members would be a good next step to confirm that.

There was discussion regarding what to do if there is no quorum. The CBOC members supported using meetings with no quorum as an informational and educational session taking no actions.

It was moved by Steve Neff and seconded by Cary Leider to adjourn the meeting at 5:21PM. The motion was passed unanimously.
