Performing Arts Ribbon Cutting



Solano Community College (SCC) officially opened its new performing arts building last Thursday evening at the ribbon cutting ceremony.

President/Superintendent Celia Esposito-Noy welcomed the group and introduced the dignitaries in attendance. Board President Rosemary Thurston, along with Christine Mani also greeted the crowd.

The newly renovated facility, also known as Building 1200, houses the theatre arts and music programs, as well as instructional classrooms, and student support space.

More than 28,000 square feet of existing space was renovated to make the new building a place of enhanced learning for students.

“What is great about this particular project is the new theatre space,” said Solano Community College President/Superintendent Celia Esposito-Noy. “Not only will students have a beautiful location in which to perform, but the college now has a space to highlight our outstanding theatre, music, and dance productions as well as other academic programs.”

The college is planning a gala event on September 9 to celebrate the building’s grand opening. Tickets can be purchased online through the SCC Educational Foundation at www.foundation.solano.edu. For more information, call (707) 864-7177.

Funding for the renovation was provided through Measure Q, Measure G and the State.

“When the community comes onto our campus, they will see how much we have grown and will agree that students are more successful when they have access to state of the art learning environments,” said Esposito-Noy.
